The RHA Board meets on the second Monday of the month. At its last meeting, the Board discussed and addressed the following items:

Townhome Drainage and Erosion. Northern Virginia Soil and Water Conservation District has been contacted to schedule a visit to come out and view the drainage and erosion issues in the townhomes and provide technical assistance with defining the most appropriate solution.

Sign Repair. Property Management is soliciting quotes for straightening and repairing signs around the community.

Townhome Recycling Bins. The recycling bins have Sept 2-5 FCPS Labor Day holiday arrived at Haulin' Trash. The Board is working with them to schedule delivery of the bins.

Hiring an Off-duty Police Officer. Efforts are under-Sept 16 POW-MIA Recognition Day way to create a job description for this person.

cations for new fences, one application for a new roof, one application for new gutters, and one application for a new porch. The next meeting will be TUESDAY, September 6 at 7:00 PM. The Committee normally meets once a month on the first Monday of the month unless there is a holiday. If you wish to submit an application for change, please do so 2-to-3 weeks prior to the meeting so that any questions can be cleared up before the meeting.

DID YOU KNOW...If you are considering making a change to your house, you can access a copy of the change application on the RHA website at https://rha-homes.org/acc-committee. Just scroll to the bottom of the page and make the appropriate choice.

**DID YOU KNOW...**There are different times to trim trees and shrubs. Some common evergreens to prune after the first frost during the upcoming winter in Northern Virginia include:

- -- Boxwood
- -- Holly (don't prune hollies during the growing season or you'll remove the berries)
- -- Live oak
- -- Southern magnolia

If you wish to shape other shrubs, particularly spring-flowering ones like azaleas, wait until they are done blooming next spring. If you prune them now, you will be cutting off the buds that will have bloomed next year. If you're not sure what to do, the best thing is to check with your favorite nursery for your particular tree or shrub.

### An Expensive Lesson: Parking, Mail Boxes, & Yellow Curbs

YELLOW CURBS and LANES: Those yellow curbs and lanes are considered "Fire Lanes". These areas provide clear access for fire and emergency personnel and their equipment in the event of an emergency. NO BLOCKING, UNLOADING, or PARK-ING in these areas 24 hours a day.

MAILBOXES: Are you expecting medicine, tax returns, stimulus checks, or a card or letter from a family member? ...NOT if you or your guests continue to block the mailboxes. It inhibits the mail carrier from having access to the box to deliver the mail.

National Cinema Day is September 3, and movie tickets at most theatres nationwide (including Worldgate AMC) will be just \$3.




<u>Virginia's Personal Property Tax</u> <u>payments</u> are due on Oct 5.
